cussive electronic music genres originally made for nightclubs, raves, and festi
vals. 💸 It is generally produced for playback by DJs who create seamles
s selections of tracks, called a DJ mix, by segueing 💸 from one recordi
ng to another. EDM producers also perform their music live in a concert or festi
val setting in what 💸 is sometimes called a live PA. Since its inceptio
n EDM has expanded to include a wide range of subgenres.</p>
<p>In the 💸 late 1980s and early 1990s, following the emergence o
f raving, pirate radio, PartyCrews, underground festivals and an upsurge of inte
rest 💸 in club culture, EDM achieved mainstream popularity in Europe. H
owever, rave culture was not as broadly popular in the United 💸 States;
it was not typically seen outside of the regional scenes in New York City, Flor
ida, the Midwest, and California. 💸 Although both electro and Chicago h
ouse music were influential both in Europe and the United States, mainstream med
ia outlets and 💸 the record industry remained openly hostile to it. The
re was also a perceived association between EDM and drug culture, which 💸
; led governments at state and city levels to enact laws and policies intended
to halt the spread of rave culture.[3]</p>
<p>Subsequently, 💸 in the new millennium, the popularity of EDM i
ncreased globally, particularly in the United States and Australia. By the early
💸 2010s, the term "electronic dance music" and the initialis
m "EDM" was being pushed by the American music industry and music 
8184; press in an effort to rebrand American rave culture.[3] Despite the indus
try's attempt to create a specific EDM brand, the 💸 acronym remains
in use as an umbrella term for multiple genres, including dance-pop, house, tec
