scoring all 18-hole scores, your friend scored 82 and you scored 85. Whichever of the two has the lower score is the winner. If you have a handicap, you would subtract it from your score to get your adjusted score. The person with the lowest adjusted score wins.

Handicap is a number that is subtracted from a golfer's score to level the playing field. It is based on a golfer's playing ability and is used to level the playing field for all players. A golfer's handicap is based on his or her best 8 scores over a period of 12 months.

How to Calculate Handicap: Take your best 8 scores over a period of 12 months and add them together. Divide the total by the number of rounds played (7 in this example). The result is your average score. Subtract the difference between your average score and the course par (72 in this example) from your average score to get your handicap.

Example: A golfer has scores of 78, 82, 85, 80, 83, 81, 79, and 84 over 7 rounds. The total score is 572. Divided by 7 rounds, the average score is 81.7. Subtracting the difference between the average score (81.7) and the course par (72) from the average score, the golfer's handicap is 9.7, which rounds down to 9.

A golfer with a handicap of 9 would subtract 9 from his or her score to get his or her adjusted score. For example, if a golfer with a 9 handicap scores an 85, his adjusted score would be 76. The golfer with the lowest adjusted score wins.
