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A Recopa Sul-Americana é uma competição de futebol disputada entre os clubes campos da Copa Libertadores e a Taça do Mundo, duas das primeiras competições dos jogos eletrônicos na América Latina.

A competição foi criada em 2003 pela Associação Sul-Americana de Futebol (CONMEBOL) com o objetivo de determinar qual é a melhor hora da América do Sul. Uma Revoada para os Estados Unidos que considera uma segunda maior importância na América Latina, nos níveis acima das Copa Libertadores.

Formato da competição

Recopa Sul-Americana é disputada em duas partes, uma na casa e uma fora entre os campos da Copa Libertadores e a Copa Sul Americana. Caso o placar agregado esteja vazio após 180 minutos de duração para as primeiras etapas do tempo que converter mais tarde.
